A student must complete a program of study which constitutes a logical whole. The Master of Arts degree requires a minimum of 30 semester hours consisting of at least 12 semester hours of course work open only to graduate students (exclusive of 7000, 7005, and 7300). A maximum of 6 hours of 7000 and 3 hours of 7300 may be applied toward the 30 hours. A minimum of 3 hours of 7300 must be listed on the program of study.

Shaded courses are required, but not included in program of study minimum hours.

required for all <b>teaching assistants</b> .
