This course is for students accepted into the Museum Studies Certificate Program who have been offered a museum studies-related internship to gain experience in an institution or organization and will earn academic and experiential credit. An academic research project is required. Enrollment is subject to approval of the course application.

This course is expected to introduce the museum studies students to professional museum practices. The student will gain practical experience and learn about museum career paths. Students will gain work skills and networking capabilities related to their field of internship.

The internship must be at least 105 hours during the semester to earn academic credit. The student is expected to meet with the faculty instructor prior to the start of the internship and after the internship ends, and to communicate regularly with the faculty instructor.

The student, along with a faculty instructor, will devise a course proposal and project description directly related to the internship position and research component of the course. Examples of research projects include – curated/interpretive exhibits, informative blogs, tour brochures or displays, archival research papers etc.

The course proposal will provide a description of the internship and how course objectives relate to the practical internship experience and academic research.

Once the course application is approved, CRN # will be created for registration.

Requirements:

- Student must be accepted into an approved internship position. **Please attach letter** of internship offer. Internships may be paid or unpaid. It is important to note that all applications for internship credit are carefully reviewed. Internships must be clearly related to museum studies.
- Student must be registered during the semester of the internship.
- The applicant must be enrolled in the museum studies certificate program and is required to register for FCID 5015/7015– maximum 3 credit hours.
- A schedule for communication between the faculty instructor and student should be determined and included.
